The US, whose military base is about 10 kilometres from China's, has also pumped money into Djibouti's digital communications infrastructure. The World Bank report notes that Djibouti Telecom, the state-owned service provider, has a significant joint venture with BringCom, a US-based communications.

Djibouti hosts about 10-12 international undersea cables on the Red Sea coast, including SMW3, EIG, SEA-ME-WE-5/6, AAE-1, EASSy, WIOCC, Yemeni, and DARE1, linking to Europe, Asia and East/Southern Africa. Djibouti Telecom invested over \$200 million in the last decade in landing stations and a.

Since its establishment in 1999, the state-owned Djibouti Telecom has dominated the country's telecommunications sector which, thanks to underwater cables, connects internet providers in over 90 countries. But given the liberalisation of the market and the emergence of new players, can the operator.

A new World Bank report cites a study by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) that shows Djibouti had the highest internet connectivity in the region at the end of last year, with 69 percent of the population online. Djibouti, with a population of about 1.1 million, reported connectivity.

Djibouti Telecom has begun construction on a new Cable Landing Station in Djibouti City. The CLS will consist of three floors, with each floor having a 250 square meter (2,690 sq ft) equipment room. The 3rd floor is reportedly reserved for colocation. The facility is expected to be completed by April 2022.

Is Djibouti Telecom creating a digital platform?

Djibouti Telecom, under the direction of its Director General Mohamed Assoweh Bouh, is building a digital platform for the region. Wingu.Africa has partnered with Djibouti ISP TO7 Network to develop a carrier-neutral data center and carrier-neutral cable landing station.

Will Djibouti launch a carrier-neutral data center?

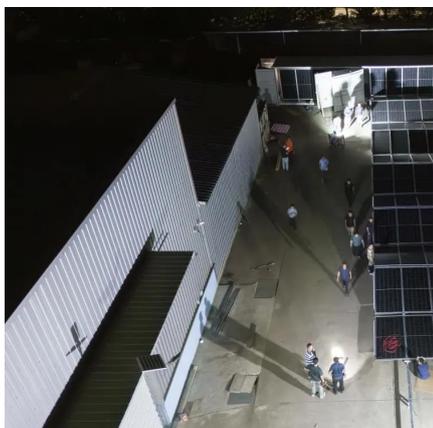



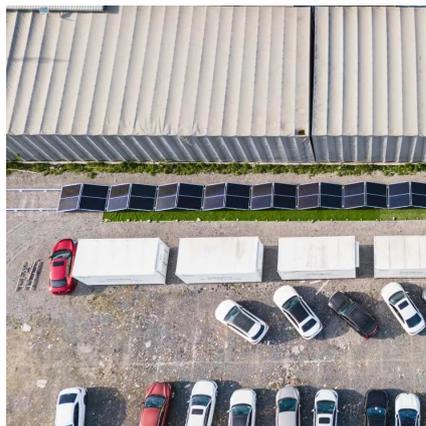
